INTRODUCTION

Each summer, in historic St. John's, Newfoundland, the Tuckamore Festival brings together up to three aspiring young composers for an exciting week of music-making. This year, the Tuckamore Festival will present the 14th Young Artist Composer program on the Memorial University campus, just a short walk from colourful downtown St. John's. This program will offer a combined virtual and in-person experience, including composition lessons leading up to June, collaboration with Young Artist Performers during the first week of the Festival, and a premiere performance during our Young Artist concert on Saturday, June 27th, 2026.

Up to three emerging young composers aged 16 and up will be invited to join us for a week of intensive study with Canadian composer Melissa Hui. Selected composers will write a 5 – 7 minute work for piano trio to be delivered (score and parts) by **May 22nd**. Student compositions will be workshopped, rehearsed, and performed by fellow Young Artists (emerging string and piano players) and faculty. Young Composers will have the opportunity to immerse themselves in daily composition masterclasses, score study sessions, and rehearsals.
